Seedlings

To learn the words 'cold' and 'ice', we made our own ice lollies. Our rhyme of the week is, 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat'- we had lots of fun pretending to be in a boat on the sea. This activity helped us to take turns, and developed our gross motor skills to push and rock the boat.



Orchard
